NARS Foundation is pleased to announce *Gut Feeling*, an exhibition featuring the photography and sculptural photographic collages of Yi Hsuan Lai. Drawing from her experience as an immigrant and transplant, Lai uses signifiers of the body to explore themes of adaptation, uncertainty, and femininity through sensual visual language. In her staged photographs, Lai employs discarded and found materials alongside portions of her body to create ambiguous yet evocative assemblages. Bubble wrap, balloons, foam, stockings, flowers, and fabric are arranged precariously, showing their visceral sense of aliveness,



capturing the tension between opposing forces, and referencing bodily sensations such as compression and release.

Utilizing a combination of studio photography and digital collage, Lai creates a series of photographic collages printed on diverse materials such as aluminum, vinyl, nylon lycra, and canvas. These images, cut and layered to reveal their sculptural quality, blur the line between soft and hard forms, flatness, and dimensionality, inviting viewers to explore visual and tactile perception shifts. She meditates on each piece as a bodily vessel, which reveals their interior space physically and psychologically.

While the photography is contained in a rectangular format, Lai extends elements from her images into the gallery space, incorporating eerily sprayed foam flowers scattered on walls or floors. A central crate filled with foam further echoes the bodily quality of her photographic work. Lai's slippery, liminal work traverses boundaries between the constructed and deconstructed, animate and inanimate, transforming disposable materials into bodily and otherworldly representations.

About the artist:

Yi Hsuan Lai received an MFA in photography from School of Visual Arts in New York City (2020) and in 2023 she received support from NYFA's Immigrant Artist Program. She also received residency fellowships from Light Work in 2024 and Vermont Studio Center in 2023. Her work was among LensCulture's Critics' Top 10 in 2022. Her solo exhibition, Anonymous Town, appeared in SPRING/BREAK Art Show (New York City, 2020). Group exhibitions include Portraits Beyond Faces at the FLOOR Gallery (Korea, 2023), Today is Yesterday's Tomorrow at the PH Museum Photo Festival (Bologna, 2022), Photo London (UK, 2023), If You Lived Here, You'd Be Home By Now at Wassaic Project (Wassaic, NY, 2021), and Smart Objects, Flattened Images at Well Well Project (Portland, OR, 2022).
